Reptile Sited At The New School

A Pteranodon was sited gliding through our new Belle Valley library. Pteranodon; in Greek means "wing" and "toothless." It comes from the Late Cretaceous geological period of North America in present day Kansas, Alabama, Nebraska, Wyoming, and South Dakota. The Pteranodon was one of the largest pterosaurs having a maximum wingspan of over 6 metres (20 ft). The Pteranodon has more fossil specimens than any other pterosaur, with about 1,200 specimens known. Pteranodon was a reptile, but not a dinosaur.
